Family Tax Benefit

As of 1 July 2009, family tax benefit is no longer claimable through the tax system and all claims should be made directly through the Family Assistance Office. If you meet the following criteria you may be eligible.

Part A

- You have dependant children up to 21 years or age; OR
- Your children are between 21 and 24 years of age and full-time students; AND
- Your family income is below these limits:

Part B

If you are the secondary earner and your partner earns \$150,000 or less, you can still get some FTB Part B if your income is below:

- \$24,291 a year if your youngest child is under 5 years of age, or
- \$18,907 a year if your youngest child is between 5-18 years of age.

Education Tax Refund (ETR)

The ETR started on 1 July 2008.

If you are eligible, you will be able to get a tax refund on education costs – **up to \$390 for each primary school student, and up to \$779 for each secondary school student.**

You are eligible if *(please indicate which of the following you fall under)*:

- You get, or are eligible for, Family Tax Benefit Part A for a child in primary or secondary school or;
- A payment was made for the child that prevented you from receiving Family Tax Benefit Part A for that child, such as Youth Allowance or;
- Your child stopped full-time school during the year and received sufficient income to prevent you receiving Family Benefit Part A, or;
- You are an independent student.
